It seems like this past year has been flying by. We have had some great times of training and learning. Adult and Student Leaders have attended Turn Your Campus, Be Still Weekend, The C.M.T.A. Convention, The C.M.T.A. Summit. Our College Students were able to attend a Listen Weekend Retreat. Our college students have also enjoyed time of connection through a Nerf War as well as time of gaming and bowling at 'Round 1'

We have had opportunities for the guys and girls to take a break and do stuff just for them. We've had the girl's Movie Night, the girl's Chocolate/Scrapbook night, the guy's *Iron Gut* night and the men's breakfast with Doc Ed Pepping from Easy Company 101st Airborne and Phil Reed. These were opportunities to discuss gender concerns and issues. We have had several opportunities for service and outreach with *Beacon Light Mission, Family Sundays* and the church wide *Easter Eggstraveganza*. We have enjoyed partnership with a number of churches and ministries in community nights of worship as well as our seventh year with *Downey March 4 Jesus*. We can give in to fear or anxiousness, or we can lean in closer to God, listen more intently for His voice and focus more on His calling. This month we begin a church wide series on "The Story". This is an opportunity for us as a whole church to simply focus on God's Story. A beautiful thing about God's Story is that there is a common thread throughout all of time that God is designing and shaping. Another beautiful and intimate thing is that the story that God crafts, affects and impacts us all personally and individually. As we begin this series, we each now have the choice to participate, engage and embrace this or to miss out on the possibilities that God has for us. This month we will also be taking a look at "What makes us tick?" We'll see how God has gifted us and how that affects our relationships with each other. As we look into this, we will see the possibilities of where God may call us to participate and lead. This will take us out of our comfort zone and some days this may lead us to consider the difference between just giving to God and being willing to sacrifice for God.

This month we will have our first Jill's House Mission Trip for the year. We will also take some time to celebrate and appreciate our senior class. This will be a great time to remember, to encourage and to set goals and choose direction for the future. I am excited for the future and for the possibilities.

Ephesians 4 says, " **4** Therefore I, a prisoner for serving the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of your calling, for you have been called by God. ² Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. ³ Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace. ⁴ For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. ⁵ There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all, in all, and living through all. ⁷ However, he has given each one of us a special gift through the generosity of Christ. ⁸ That is why the Scriptures say, "When he ascended to the heights, he led a crowd of captives and gave gifts to his people."

⁹ Notice that it says "he ascended." This clearly means that Christ also descended to our lowly world.¹⁰ And the same one who descended is the one who ascended higher than all the heavens, so that he might fill the entire universe with himself.

¹¹ Now these are the gifts Christ gave to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers. ¹² Their responsibility is to equip God's people to do his work and build up the church, the body of Christ. ¹³ This will continue until we all come to such unity in our faith and knowledge of God's Son that we will be mature in the Lord, measuring up to the full and complete standard of Christ. ¹⁴ Then we will no longer be immature like children. We won't be tossed and blown about by every wind of new teaching. We will not be influenced when people try to trick us with lies so clever they sound like the truth. ¹⁵ Instead, we will speak the truth in love, growing in every way more and more like Christ, who is the head of his body, the church. ¹⁶ He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love."

This passage was brought up in a staff meeting, but I don't think it was by accident that it also was the kick off passage for the current Gifts series. Three things that pop out to me are the following:

We are called to be UNIFIED.

We are all gifted and have a place.

We are called to ACTION.

As the Month of May is a time of Spring and Growth, I'm looking forward to how we might grow as a church.

Praying God would show us new ways to grow,


Mom I love you and never forget and anytime you are feeling down remember that my little hands will always be reaching underneath the door looking for your help.



My experience at "Rainbow Acres" by Lupe Lopez

This place exists because someone had a dream. A dream to offer adults with learning disabilities a place where they could live to their fullest potential with dignity and purpose.

Being there felt like visiting a little piece of Heaven. Everyone was so nice and loving towards each other and welcoming towards us. The founder wanted the adults living there to be called "Ranchers".

My goal was to go there and help the ranchers with special needs. But my contribution was so little compared to all the blessings I received by simply being there and spending time with the Ranchers.

They are incredible people and you can see and feel Gods hands on this facility and people's lives.

On my first day, I was so impressed to see Susan one of the ranchers raising her hand every time someone wanted a prayer request - she speed walked over them eager to pray I thought to myself I want to be like Susan (her disability is not stopping her from serving God). I had to ask how many times have I not prayed for someone for fear of messing up – I want to be more like Susan.

Next day I met wonderful Greg. so full of information I felt he was like Google search engine in a person - you could ask him anything and in a few minutes he had the answer but that's not what impressed me about him but his heart he talked about how his father had hurt him and made him cry when he was young. But he wasn't angry at him anymore for he had forgiven him. We visited his home and one night he said, thank you for coming and getting to know us and please tell others that people with disabilities deserve to live too, some people think we shouldn't exist. We live in a special place and we are happy here! How many times have I held grudges against those who have hurt me but not Greg.

Then there was Daniel who had just watched the movie "The Shack" and wanted me to help him to understand whether it was a dream or an out of the body experience. I said, Daniel, if I could only be as smart as you I could help you but I'm not. I don't know - He later asked me what I thought of those with Autism, he shared that he believed that some think that people with mental disabilities are evil and he assured me that he was not. I can't wait to see him again and find out what movie he has seen next.

I forgot to mention my experience with Harold, he was a super friendly and had an incredible memory. I met him when we had lunch with the Ranchers and in one of our conversations he shared that he had memorized all the books of the bible so we agreed while I was there he would help me memorize the books of the bible too, so every time we saw each other he would recite them to me and I would recite some them back. I came back memorizing more books than I've ever known before. I can't wait to go back and see him again and learn more books and see his never ending smile.

And at last but not least there was this awesome lady who upon hearing the founder's sermon took a year off work and left beautiful Hawaii to go to Arizona for one year, after that year she never went back to Hawaii. She felt her job there was so rewarding she loved what this Rainbow Acres does for the ranchers. she's now in her late 60's she retired and volunteers every day for 4 hours. People can't seem to leave this place.

My advice to everyone if you haven't been there? Go and be blessed!
