As the year closes, it seems like everything goes by faster. I'm not sure if it's because people are rushing to get things done or because schedules tend to be packed so tight. There always seems to be something to do, somewhere to go, or someone to meet. But I don't think that was supposed to be the norm.

If we were to take a look back on the purpose of some of these holidays, regardless if we are talking about Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas or New Year's Day, the original goal was for that day to be set aside to celebrate or commemorate something or someone.

As this year closes up, I think it would be wise to remember the idea of being 'set apart'. It's term we use in church to describe the idea of being 'set apart', to be 'holy'.

If you have a personal relationship with Christ where you have repented from sin, if you believe that Christ is God's Son who died on the cross for your sin, was buried and has risen again, and if you have accepted the gift of eternal life, you are part of God's family, one of His children. It means that you are 'Set Apart' as a child of God.

Jesus' Prayer of Thanksgiving

²⁵ At that time Jesus prayed this prayer: "O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, thank you for hiding these things from those who think themselves wise and clever, and for revealing them to the childlike. ²⁶ Yes, Father, it pleased you to do it this way! ²⁷ "My Father has entrusted everything to me. No one truly knows the Son except the Father, and no one truly

knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him."

²⁸ Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.²⁹ Take my voke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. Matthew 11:25-29New Living Translation (NLT)

Reviewing Past Events



Thanksgiving: it's History in Fact and Myth by Jim Fountain

One author (Johnson) said that "the tradition of the Pilgrims' first Thanksgiving is steeped in myth and legend." He goes one to say that "the Pilgrims" first Thanksgiving began at some unknown date between Sept. 21 and Nov. 9, most likely in very early Oct. Accordingly, there were only two accounts of those present. First is Edward Winslow's date Dec. 12, 1621. Winslow said that the corn (or wheat) did well, but that the peas were parched by the sun. Fowl was killed as well as deer. The second description was written 20 years afterwards by William Bradford but not discovered until 1854. Bradford's *History of Plymouth Plantation* "prompted a greater American interest in the history of the Pilgrims. It is also in this account that the Thanksgiving turkey tradition is founded." (Johnson) The "Thanksgiving 'menu', namely five deer, a large number of turkeys and waterfowl, cod, and bass; plus the harvest, which consisted of wheat, corn, barley, and perhaps any peas that survived the scorching" were the few item mentioned by Johnson's article. A "Popcorn Myth" that the Indians introduced this corn was untrue; it was the Northern Flint corn which does not pop well – parched to make a snack or ground up and mixed with strawberries for a cake-like dessert.¹

Another article (Smithsonian Institution) states that the Pilgrim's Thanksgiving Feast of 1621 was not the first one of its kind. There was one on May 27, 1878 in Newfoundland and another by the Popham Colony in Maine in 1607. Also Jamestown had two in 1607 and 1610. "The pilgrims with a puritanical rejection of public religious display, held a non-religious Thanksgiving feast, aside from saying grace." (Smithsonian) The fact was that in 1623 the Pilgrims at Plymouth Plantation, Massachusetts had another Thanksgiving due to a drought that destroyed their crops. Shortly thereafter, Capt. Mile Standish came with supplies and news that another supply ship was coming, did the colonists hold a day of thanksgiving and prayer that combined a religious and social celebration on June 30, 1623.²

One more resource, Greener, started with this statement: "The idea of the American Thanksgiving feast is a fairly recent fiction ... it was only after the first World War that a version of such Puritan-Indian partnership took hold in elementary schools across the American landscape. We can thank the invention of textbooks and their mass purchase by public schools for embedding this 'Thanksgiving ' image in our modern minds ... the first Thanksgiving Day did occur in the year 1637, but it was nothing like our Thanksgiving today." It was proclaimed as a celebration for the safe return of heavily armed hunters or colonial volunteers who went from Massachusetts to Connecticut where they massacred 700 Pequot Indians. Only "the United American Indians of New England meet each year at Plymouth Rock on Cole's Hill for a Day of Mourning" remember this murder over 375 years ago and largely forgotten by "white people, by European Christians." (Greener) The article goes on to say that our modern, festive Thanksgiving "began with the greatest of misunderstandings, a true clash of cultural values and fundamental principles...Did the Pilgrims sharing their thanksgiving meal with the local Indians, the Wampanoag and Pequot? No. That never happened. That is, until its inclusion in the 'Thanksgiving Story' in 1890."³


